Still to come during April, are the Organ+concerts at St Denys' Church (details on page 7), featuring music performed by the unusual combination of organ+cello and organ+saxophone. Excellent coffee is available on arrival.

The leaflet containing details of the summer concerts taking us right into October will be out soon, featuring a feast of performers from far and near. Rounding off the season will be a Saturday Lunchtime concert at St Columba's given by Jamie Hitel from Christ Church, Greenwich, USA.

In between all the events of the last month here in York, I found time to make two visits to London: First was the London Organ Day followed in quick succession by a visit to St John's Upper Norwood, where there is a magnificent T C Lewis, recently restored by H&H and further enhanced by the addition of a new 32' Sub Bass.

The original Lewis console, in allowing the player to see and hear clearly over its low top, necessitates the layout of the stop heads in rows of four across. This took me a few minutes to get to grips with, but the instrument was well worth the journey.

We have a busy time ahead as we move towards Mothering Sunday, Passiontide, Holy Week, and Easter itself... so music to prepare and perform, this year I try and include some time for relaxation!

St Austin's Catholic Church Wakefield, part of the Diocese of Leeds is looking to appoint an organist from Easter 2025

BACKGROUND

St Austin's Church dates from 1828 making it one of the oldest churches in the Diocese. The actual Parish is St Austin and The English Martyrs which consists of two churches, both in Wakefield.

St Austin's has a long musical tradition and a choir has been in service for nearly two hundred years. The Director of Music has been in post for 19 years and his predecessor for 42 years.

The current organ is a digital 3 manual Ahlborn Galanti although there is a strong desire to install a suitable pipe organ when funds allow.



The organist would be required to accompany the choir at the solamn Sunday Mass where the repertoire generally includes a chant or polyphonic Mass plus motets. In addition, there is a rehearsal to accompany the choir on Sunday evenings. A further commitment to services on Holy Days, Holy Week and major feasts is also required. There are also extra services and concerts for which the organist would be eligible to receive additional feas. An ability to accompany plainchant would be desirable though is not essential.

St Austin's Choir has an excellent reputation and is widely regarded as one of the finest liturgical choirs outside of a Cathedral setting. They have enjoyed tours to Rome (singing in 3 of the 4 major basilices), Paris, including a recital in Notre Dame, Austria including Salzburg Cathedral and most recently Northern Spain, including Mass and recital in Avila cathedral, the home of Tomas de Luis Victoria.

Whitst the majority of the repertoire is European Renaissance polyphony, more modern music is enjoyed along with new compositions by the prizewinning Composer in Residence.

JOB SPECIFICATION

An annual fee of £6000 applies, paid monthly on receipt of invoice. This covers:

- 40 weeks per annum Sunday Solemn Mass (currently 11.00am)
- Sunday evening rehearsal (currently 7:30pm to 9:30pm)

- Holy Week Services Maundy Thursday evening
- Good Friday
- Easter Saturday Vigil

- Major Feast Days (where not celebrated on Sundays) Epiphany
- Presentation of The Lord
- Ash Wednesday
- The Ascension of The Lord
- St Peter & St Paul
- The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary
- All Saints
- All Souls
- Christmas Eve Midnight Mass (usually celebrated at 11pm)
- Mass of Christmas Day

Additional responsibilities may include (depending on candidate):

- Assist the Director of Music and Parish Priest in planning music for all services.
- Organise replacement/deputy organists on occasion
- Arrange for servicing and maintenance of the organ
- Deputise for the Director of Music in directing the choir in occasional practices and services when the Director of Music is away.

Additional fees will be paid as below:

- Weddings £150
- Funerals £100
- Extra services or rehearsals £65
- Concerts/Recitals/Tours by negotiation.

A student in full time education will be considered as an organ scholar.

The list of responsibilities could be tailored to the needs of the student and choir with an appropriate adjustment to salary.

The successful applicant will require an enhanced DBS.


